## Chairmen's RoundTable Greet Four New Execs

For eight years, local small-business owners in need of a little free advice and mentorship have had the option of turning to the 40-plus members belonging to the Chairmen's RoundTable.

Starting this month, there will be even more members to go around, as the local nonprofit welcomes four new executive members.

All members in the Chairmen's RoundTable are either current or retired chief executive officers who volunteer to mentor and advise small-business owners. The four newest members of the group are John Reardon, Dennis Bertken, Steven Osinski and Bill Lennartz.

"Local companies will benefit from the breadth of experience that these new mentors add to our membership," said RoundTable Chairman Tom Dorosewicz upon the March 1 announcement. "At last count, our members have cumulatively served in 127 CEO/presidential positions, sat on 264 boards of directors and 177 advisory boards. I am proud of the commitment of time and care that each of our members has given to help local executives address critical strategic issues facing their businesses."

Reardon is founder and president of the RTC Group, an international media company serving the industrial computer market. He also serves on the boards of several companies, including SBE, Inc. and Escondido-based One Stop Systems.

Bertken is president of Encinitas-based Pacific Pathway, a trading and investment company focused on building and acquiring brands and companies competing in international marketplaces. He has served as CEO, chief operating officer and executive management positions for companies including One Touch Systems, Inc., Apollo Group and Ecompanies/Change.com, where he built up extensive international market development experience.

Osinski has a marketing and advertising background with a special emphasis within the wireless and telecommunications industry. His experience in executive management includes stints with Smart Group, which he founded, and TMP Worldwide/Monster, the online job finder site where workers post their resumes for prospective employers to view.

And finally, Lennartz is president and CEO of the San Diego Aerospace Museum. He has also served as CEO for Kearny Mesa-based Reynolds Mason Machining, Carlsbad-based California Linear Devices, Avcon, Inc., Kearny Mesa-based Sciteq Electronics and Lencor International.
